
What are the objectives?

- Contribute to the development of EU policies in combatting and preventing trafficking in human beings and protecting its
- Support the implementation of the EU Strategy on Combatting trafficking in human beings and the EU Anti-Trafficking Directive.
- Exchange best practices and reinforce cooperation among experts and practitioners in the field of trafficking in human beings.



What are the immediate priorities?

- Facilitate the implementation of EU Anti-Trafficking Directive, by focusing on the concept of labour exploitation, the roles of the national Anti-Trafficking Coordinators and Rapporteurs, the now formalised and reinforced national referral mechanism and the extended data collection obligations.
- In support of the EU Anti-Trafficking Coordinator, work closely with national competent authorities, civil society organisations and **other relevant stakeholders** to provide research outputs and contribute to the EU Strategy on Combatting Trafficking in Human Beings and to the monitoring of the progress made in the EU on combatting trafficking in human beings.





How will the EU **Anti-Trafficking Hub work?**

Under the lead of the EU Anti-Trafficking Coordinator, the Hub will engage with stakeholders to serve as a platform for effective efforts, participatory dialogue, and creative thinking that leads to genuine knowledge production and exchange.
